ATGENDER – A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR GENDER RESEARCH, EDUCATION AND DOCUMENTATION

The association aims to:

- 1) provide a professional association for the interdisciplinary field of Women's and Gender Studies, Feminist Research and activities that promote gender equality and diversity in Europe.
- 2) provide a forum for advancing and disseminating the knowledge produced in the field of Women's and Gender Studies and Feminist Research in Europe and beyond.
- 3) develop and support international cooperation in Women's and Gender Studies and Feminist Research in Europe and beyond.
- 4) support and sustain the institutionalisation of Women's and Gender Studies and Feminist Research.
- 5) strengthen the visibility of the field of Women's and Gender Studies and Feminist Research vis-à-vis national, regional, and European funding agencies for research and education.
- 6) foster exchange and collaboration between the academic community and women's organisations, women's documentation centres and libraries, policy-makers in the field of gender equality and diversity, NGO's for gender equality and diversity, and ambassadors for diversity in business and non-profit organisations.
- 7) support students and young researchers with an interest in Women's and Gender Studies and Feminist Research.

ATGENDER – THE WAY THE SPRING CONFERENCE WILL WORK

The different parts of the conference have been set up in such a way to accommodate the process of sharing the same commitment to make **ATGENDER** a strong and effective network by strengthening research and policy making within the fields of gender & women's studies, feminist research and gender equality in Europe.

On Friday we start with a welcome and keynote by Donna Haraway, followed by short exploratory sessions of the 9 workshops, drinks and dinner to facilitate getting to know each other.

On Saturday all nine workshops will have three sessions each to establish different forms of cooperation. Participants bring to their workshop their interest in research, education, documentation, activism, gender policies and professional development. During the workshop sessions on Saturday the participant explore and decide on how they want to cooperate in the future. There will be *no academic paper presentations*, but a meeting of professionals who design the way they want to work in **ATGENDER**. This means intensive conversations to design ways in which **ATGENDER** can play a role in supporting the cooperation between **ATGENDER** members who share an interest in the topic of the workshop. The workshops present their plans in the General Assembly of **ATGENDER** at the end of the Saturday. At the General Assembly elections for the new board of **ATGENDER** will take place. At the assembly, the candidates for the elections will explain how they intend to support and build on the plans that have been proposed. On Sunday morning there will be space and time for follow ups.

1. What are the themes of the workshops and how do they relate to the ATHENA-heritage?
2. What is expected from me as conference participant?
3. What forms should the plans from the workshops have?
4. What has the **ATGENDER** board done to prepare the support of the new plans?

1. What are the themes of the workshops and how do they relate to the ATHENA-heritage?

The workshop-themes have been selected at a meeting (Brussels, November 2010) of **ATGENDER** -members and former ATHENA working groups coordinators who expressed an interest to become active in **ATGENDER**. Some of the themes have a long tradition within ATHENA, others are new. Before the list was finalized, all **ATGENDER** -members and all former ATHENA-partners have been invited to propose themes & topics. The result:

1. **Gender equality in Europe:** research, politics and training

2. What is expected from conference participants?

- a. Decide what workshop you want to participate in. If you are not yet sure, on Friday there will be a one-hour exploratory session of all workshops, you can go there and finalize your decision.
- b. Think about what you want to do for **ATGENDER** and what **ATGENDER** could do for you.
- c. Prepare and bring to the meeting your plans and ideas: Do you want to establish a working group with shared research interest? Do you want to find partners for joint research application? Do you want to work towards a splendid panel at the Budapest conference? Do you want to set up joint teaching or educational exchange? Whatever it is prepare by formulating your ideas, explore possibilities for funding of in your home country/institution. Remember that **ATGENDER** has *not a budget as Athena had*, all activities must therefore be self-funding. If your interest is research-focused, bring a description that you can hand out or present. Do not prepare the presentations of an academic paper, this conference is meant to create networks and structures for cooperation.

d. Find out whether there would be others interested in joining the activities, even when they are not now at the **ATGENDER** spring conference. Bring their names.

3. What forms should the plans from the workshops have?

- Proposal for a permanent working group within **ATGENDER** (permanent working groups should be open to all members)
- Proposal for a volume in the **ATGENDER** teaching-with gender book series
- Proposal for a research project and grant application
- Proposal for a panel, an activity or event at the Budapest conference
- Proposal for a grant application in which **ATGENDER** will serve as dissemination (research, educational project, mobility, conference)
- Setting up a specific activity within **ATGENDER** (e.g. website, newsletter, coaching and mentoring network, job or internship exchange, database of experts, advisory group for quality assessment procedures of educational programmes)

All proposals should contain, next to a description:

- a. names of people committed to making it work,
- b. time frame,
- c. if a budget is involved: the ideas to find money and
- d. description how the plan will strengthen **ATGENDER** and its membership.

All workshops will provide a very short oral report in the plenary, and the proposal will be included in the conference report. Workshop participants should make sure a one page proposal is handed in at the end of the conference.

4. What has the present **ATGENDER** board done to prepare the support of the new plans?

The ATGENDER board has decided to spend the limited funds that were available on the following:

- Support of 8th European Feminist Research Conference: all **ATGENDER** members will receive reduced fees for this conference, and money for student grants will be made available, there are two ATGENDER representatives in the Conference board, and the conference themes have been established that connect with the interests of
- Four volumes in the **ATGENDER** Teaching-with-Gender series.
- A modest budget to disseminate and reinforce the impact of Tuning Gender Studies Brochure as a tool in quality assessment in education in the field of gender & women's & feminist studies.

ATGENDER – THE FUTURE AFTER THIS CONFERENCE

A new board will be elected. This will allow, simultaneously, to give continuity to the work that has been done, strengthening **ATGENDER**'s sustainability as the European platform for Women's and Gender Studies, Feminist Research, women's rights, gender equality and diversity; and to materialize **ATGENDER**'s impetus towards a transversal action, by bringing different geographical points and generations closer to decision making.

New working groups (with chairs) will be formed to develop their projects on themes discussed during the conference in the working groups.

Such groups will prepare to present their work at the 8th European Feminist Research Conference (Budapest, 2012),

and/or publish in the Teaching with Gender Series The first volumes of *Teaching With Gender Series* and the *Tuning Gender Studies Brochure* under **ATGENDER**'s supervision will be discussed. **ATGENDER**'s aim is to make this series a real and effective tool to be used by educational agents dealing with Gender/Women Studies.

And/or make plans for applications joint conference visits, joint participation in other conferences, setting up of networks.

A new website, more interactive, will allow **ATGENDER** members to use it, not only to search for information but to manage the information they want to make available about their academic programs, conferences, research areas, initiatives to promote gender equality.

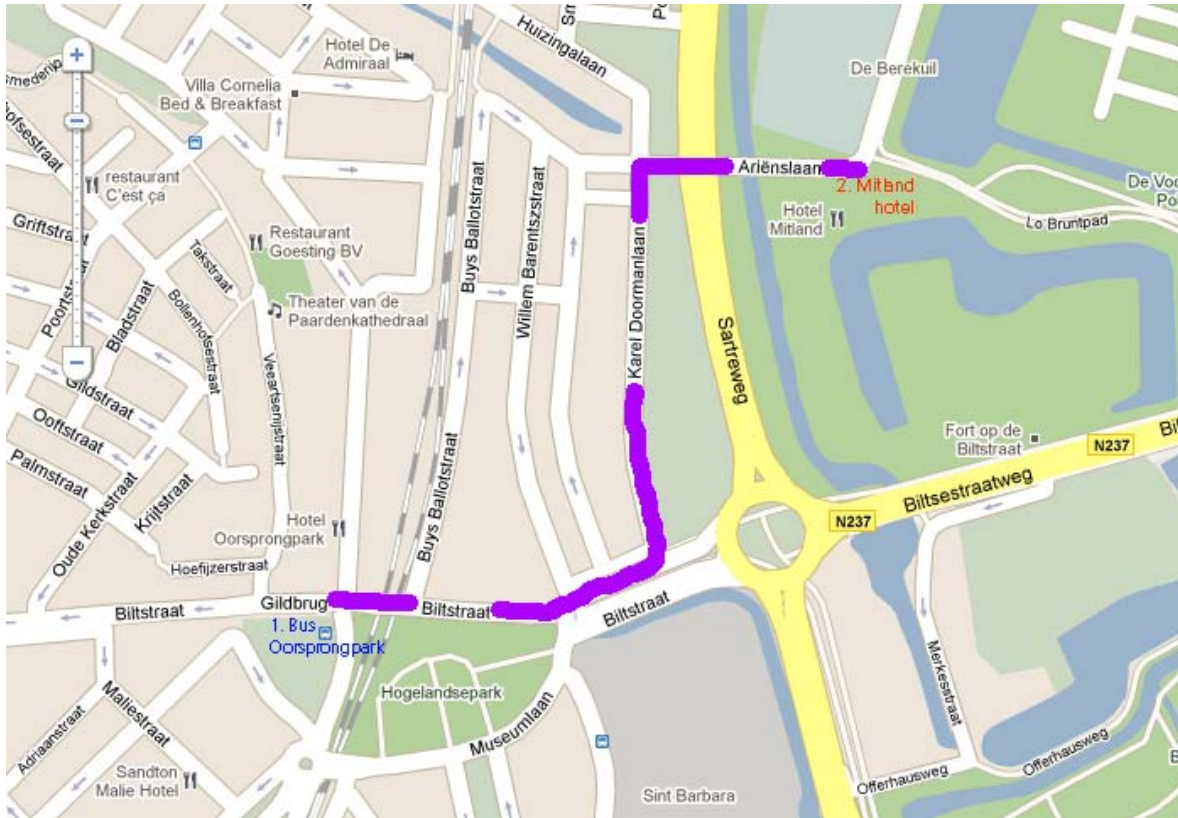
New steps on the preparation for the 8th European Feminist Conference will follow: the call for papers, the application for strands coordinators. These will request **ATGENDER**'s members' direct involvement.

DIRECTIONS: HOW TO GET TO THE VARIOUS VENUES

How to get from Amsterdam Schiphol Airport to Utrecht Central Station

You can travel from Amsterdam Schiphol Airport to Utrecht Central Station by train. There is a direct train connection between Schiphol and Utrecht, which leaves every 15 minutes. The journey is around 30 minutes. You can buy a ticket at a yellow ticket machine (cash and/ or card⁴) or at the train desk (+ €0,50 administrative costs). The price for a single journey is €7,70.

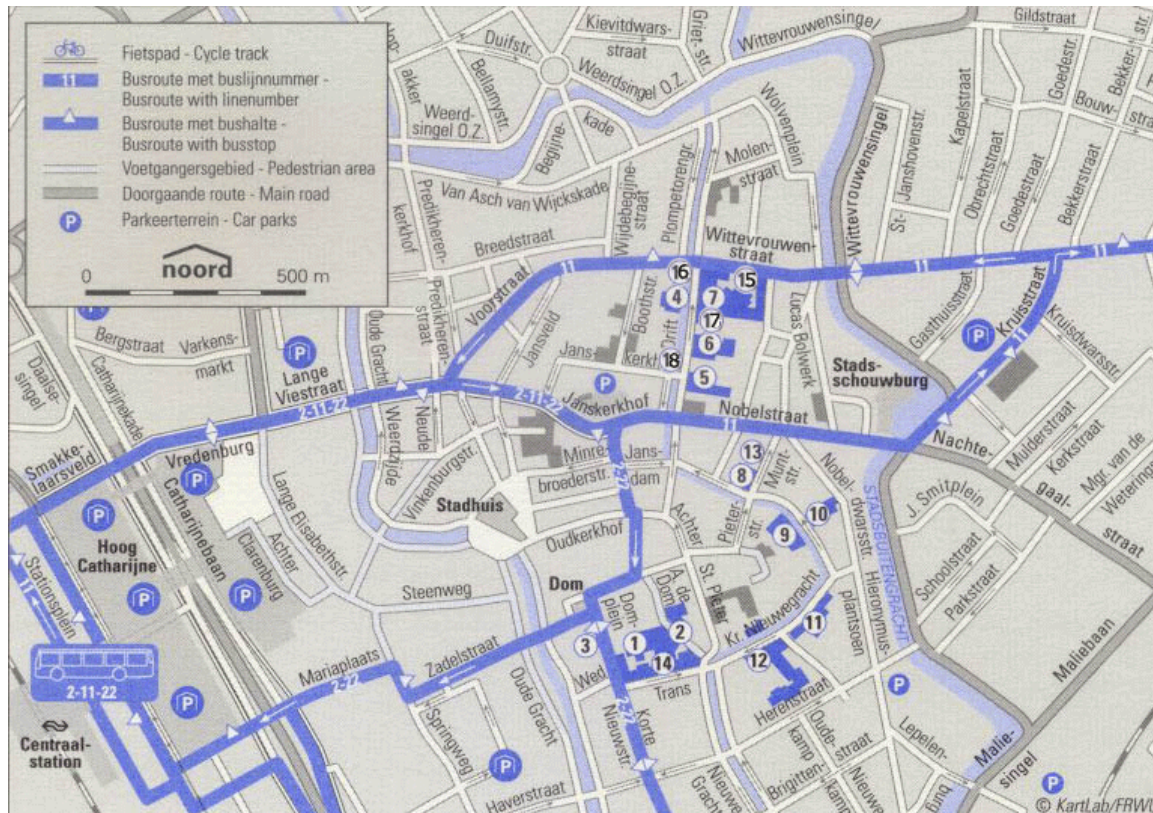
When you arrive in Utrecht you have to leave the Central Station by following 'Busstation Stadsvervoer'. To travel to the hotel you can take city bus 4 or 11, which both leaves every 5 minutes. The journey will take around 10 minutes. You have to get out of the bus at bus stop *Oorsprongpark*. You can ask the bus driver to give you a sign when you arrive at this stop. From 'Oorsprongpark' you have to walk to the hotel by following the purple route on the map (from point 1. [Bus Oorsprongpark](#) to point 2. [Mitland hotel](#) underneath). This walk will take another 10 minutes.



⁴ Make note only MasterCards with a chip will be accepted in the ticket machines. MasterCards with only magnetic bands will not function. There are ticket offices available.

How to get from Hotel Mitland to the Academiegebouw

The Academiegebouw is right next to the Dom in the Utrecht city centre. Please see number 1 on the map above. From hotel Mitland you can take almost any bus from bus stop 'Oorsprongpark' to bus stop 'Janskerkhof'. If you get out of the bus, cross the street into the Domstraat and walk all the way to the Dom church. You can go around the church on the right side (you will pass the Dom on your right). The Academiegebouw is situated on the left corner. It is the building with the round ball right in front of the entrance.

How to get from Utrecht Central Station to the Academiegebouw

The Academiegebouw is right next to the Dom in the Utrecht city centre. Please see number 1 on the map above. When you arrive in Utrecht you have to leave the Central Station by following 'Busstation Stadsvervoer'. To travel to the Academiegebouw you can take amongst other buses city bus 4 or 11, which both leave frequently. The journey will take around 5 minutes. You have to get out of the bus at bus stop 'Janskerkhof'. You can ask the bus driver to give you a sign when you arrive at this stop. If you get out of the bus, walk back to café Broers on the corner and turn left into Domstraat and walk all the way to the Dom church. You can go around it on the right side (passing the Dom on your left side). The Academiegebouw is situated on the left corner. It is the building with the round ball at the entrance.

REIMBURSEMENT GRANT POLICY

ATGENDER board members will be fully reimbursed.

If you received an official letter that you received one of the grants the following reimbursement information is addressed to you:

*The grant for the **ATGENDER** Spring conference pays for:*

- Registration fee for the **ATGENDER** Spring Conference;
- A keynote lecture by Professor Donna Haraway;
- 2 nights accommodation (Friday April 8 – Sunday April 10) in Hotel Mitland unless you were informed differently;
- Dinner on Friday April 8 (Academiegebouw) and Saturday April 9 (Mitland);
- All lunches and coffee breaks on: Friday April 8, Saturday April 9 and Sunday April 10;
- 2 drinks after the Donna Haraway lecture at the Academiegebouw

ATGENDER will reimburse:

- Travel to and from Utrecht to a maximum of €250. Because funds are limited we ask you kindly to keep this in mind when making travel arrangements. Please contact the **ATGENDER** Coordination before March 1st, 2011, if your travel costs will exceed the €250;
- Please use the reimbursement form in your information package to claim your costs, additionally printed copies will be available during the conference. Make note reimbursement will only take place if all proof of expenses (receipts, tickets, boarding passes etc) are provided with the reimbursement form;
